BISHOPS' PASTORAL MESSAGE — August 2023.

Dear Gizo Diocese collaborators, benefactors, people of God,



In my last message I only remember the most important things, I forget all the rest

What is the most important message I can leave you after these 24 years in the Solomons and 16 years in Gizo?

I came to Gizo right after the earthquake and

tsunami of 2007 and I could notice the hardships you endured having been so affected... I saw the sadness in your eyes for being victims of such great disaster. It was easy for me to look for a motto for my episcopacy. I saw my mission as the one of 'encouraging', inspiring' supporting you in your sufferings. "Lift up your hearts"... If I could only help you to 'lift up your hearts' you would have managed your sad situation in a better way and it would be a big joy for me and my mission as your shepherd. No one can help people to lift up their hearts if he/she himself/herself is down hearted. The faithful of the Gizo Diocese needed stand up around a specific mission first individually and then together in communion.

To lift up the heart of others we need "courage" and "enthusiasm" in our personal life. The word "courage" comes from the latin word "cor", the heart, the center of passion for life and the word "enthusiasm" comes from Greek "En Theos" (with God) the motivating force of grace which supports

all courage and all pastoral action.

• The assumption of Mary which we are about to celebrate is a perfect example of courage and Enthusiasm. She put her personal plans aside and she said that YES to the dream of God for Humanity... which entailed her courage to defend that yes at the foot of the cross. Because of this she was awarded with her assumption into heaven, body and Spirit.

•My other model has been Don Bosco, the saint who inspired me to say my yes to His plan... till my last breath (his words)

•By this passion in the heart with the motivation of God's Grace I tried to make my life His gift to you. I saw your pain, I sat, planned and dreamt with you, we worked together with passion sustained by God's grace in building His kingdom in our hearts... trying to be a model to our youth.

•This communion of passion and motivation enabled us to put together some important projects for the Education, Evangelization

and Health care for our people.

•As I end my commitment and pass on the Diocese to a young man from Guale allow me to invite you to give him the same support you have given me.

•May our benefactors and volunteers contin-

ue to journey with us.

•May the good Lord through His Mother and St John Bosco continue to give us COURAGE AND ENTHUSIASM and keep us united as we give priority to His kingdom. All the rest (including buildings and programs) are only logistics and technology

•With my blessings and availability if still

needed.

Brief History of Late Fr. Simon Suvenava OP.

The late Fr. Simon Suvenava OP was born on 25th January 1955 and was the 5th of nine children brought up in a Christian family.

His parents Joseph Dokekana and Clara Dokekana with the help of our church leaders, inspired the Late Fr. Simon Suvenava to have the vision to become a priest.

He attended St Joseph's Moli School from 1964-1967 from classes 1-4 in the primary level. From 1968-1970 he attended classes 5-7 at Nila Primary School in Shortlands.

In the year 1971, he left for Bougainville to complete forms 1 – 4 at St Joseph's Rigu, Kieta. After a couple of years of completing his studies up to Form 4, he attended St. Peter Chanel Minor Seminary for Forms 5 and 6 from 1975 to 1976 at Rabaul.

His vision to become a priest gave him the opportunity to enter the Novitiate in 1977 as the Holy Spirit Major Seminary was just a doorstep ahead and immediately these took him from 1978 till he was ordained priesthood in 1985 at his homeland at Sirovanga Catholic Mission Station.

He served as a priest for 37 years and 7 months.

He was called to rest after a fall from the priest's house at Sirovanga. He battled some kind of generalized health issues due to frequent viral attacks.

His priestly motto:

DO NOT BE AFRAID LITTLE FLOCK.

Late Fr Simon Suvenava OP was a gentle, humble and welcoming person. His priestly seniority shaped him into a person open to everybody. He was a kind priest with humility. We Will never forget All his good deeds serving the people of our beloved Diocese Gizo and abroad.

COMPLICATION OF STRESS

Can Stress Cause High Blood

When you are stressed, your body responds in a couple of ways. Your heart rate and pulse quicken,

your muscles tighten, and your blood pressure also rises. Being in a constant state of stress has been linked to the development of high blood pressure.

High blood pressure is a condition that increases your risk of developing heart conditions. If left undiagnosed, it can be fatal.

The Connection Between Stress and High Blood Pressure.

It's established that your blood pressure may rise when you are in a stressful situation. When

stressed, your body releases adrenaline and cortisol into your bloodstream. The sudden surge of these hormones triggers a phenomenon known as a "fight or flight" response.

When your body is in this state, your heart rate

When your body is in this state, your heart rate quickens, your blood levels constrict, and your blood pressure levels rise. However, stress doesn't necessarily mean you'll continue living with elevated blood pressure. These symptoms dissipate once the stressor is eliminated and your blood pressure levels return to normal. There are two forms of stress: acute and chronic stress.

Acute Stress

Acute stress is typically temporary, brought on by a single event that will pass with time. For instance, you might feel acute stress while in the middle of an argument, but the sensation will pass once the dispute has been resolved. While your blood pressure might spike when you are feeling acute stress, it's unlikely to remain elevated. It's also

normal for your blood pressure levels to fluctuate throughout the day based on various factors. However, if left unchecked, it's possible for acute stress to develop into chronic stress. If you continue to expose yourself to a stressor after your first encounter with the stressor, it can cause chronic stress to develop.

Chronic Stress

Chronic stress, on the other hand, is more long-term than acute stress. With chronic stress, you are in a state of stress for a prolonged period. For instance, if you work in a demanding job that

causes stress, you might feel stressed for as long as you are in that job. While researchers are a little unclear on the link between chronic stress and high blood pressure, chronic stress has been identified as one of the most likely culprits causing the development of high blood pressure. Stress causes you to develop unhealthy habits that can lead to medical complications. These have been shown to heighten your risk of high blood pressure significantly.
