The word of God is something alive and active: it cuts more incisively than any two-edged sword: it can seek out the place where soul is divided from spirit, or joints from marrow; it can pass judgment on secret emotions and thoughts.

Some practical point for the month of the Bible:

- Keep the bible well in sight on a prominent place in the house
- Find some time as a family to sit down, keep quite, and ask the Spirit for enlightenment
- Read the passage slowly and aloud...
- Repeat some striking words...
- Pause in silence and ask yourself why these words are striking you
- Share the thoughts with your family, the fruits the word of God is inspiring to you
- End by praying for each other and for your community, village, parish, diocese and the whole church
- Take a good resolution to live the message you received and to proclaim it with your good example

This passage of the Bible tells us that the word of God does not need more power from us humans to make it stronger... It is already strong enough, there is nothing than even a good homily or explanation can add to the power of the word...its power is in its message but most of all in the power of the messenger: God Himself, Christ his son and the Holy Spirit, source of all strength. The passage also says what the bible is for: it passes judgments on our thoughts and life...it shows us that what we do is right or wrong... What we can only do in the Bible month is not to make the word more powerful... but to 'keep quiet deep inside and be ready to receive it' Preparing the ground where the seed of the word will fall must be the effort we all make this month

We can do that by:

- Avoiding being aggressive and talkative all the time
- Being at peace deep inside...with our conscience keeping quiet especially during those moments during the day we put aside for prayer
- creating silence all around and inside us so that we can 'listen carefully' by reading his word

The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary (Solemnity) 15th Wednesday




The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary into Heaven at the end of her earthly life is a defined dogma of the Catholic Church. The Feast of the Assumption, celebrated every year on August 15, is a very old feast of the Church, celebrated universally by the sixth century. It commemorates the death of Mary and her bodily assumption into Heaven, before her body could begin to decay—a foretaste of our own bodily resurrection at the end of time. Because it signifies the Blessed Virgin's passing into eternal life, it is the most important of all Marian feasts and a holy day of obligation.

The feast was originally celebrated in the East, where it is known as the Feast of the Dormition, a word which means "the falling asleep." The earliest printed reference to the belief that Mary's body was assumed into Heaven dates from the fourth century, in a document entitled "The Falling Asleep of the Holy Mother of God." The document recounts, in the words of the Apostle John, to whom Christ on the Cross had entrusted the care of His mother, the death, laying in the tomb, and assumption of the Blessed Virgin. Tradition places Mary's death at Jerusalem or at Ephesus, where John was living.

On November 1, 1950, Pope Pius XII, exercising papal infallibility, declared in "Munificentissimus Deus" that it is a dogma of the Church "that the Immaculate Mother of God, the ever Virgin Mary, having completed the course of her earthly life, was assumed body and soul into heavenly glory." As a dogma, the Assumption is a required belief of all Catholics; anyone who publicly dissents from the dogma, Pope Pius declared, "has fallen away completely from the divine and Catholic Faith."


