Diocese month for FATHERS (DADDIES) " Speak out the Truth with Love."

Dear Catholic faithful of the Gizo Diocese, During this year 2013 the whole Catholic Church is committed to renew its faith: in spirit, in style and in fruitfulness.

Our faith must become deeper in relationship with the person of Jesus Christ: his person, his message, his style of life

Our faith must be shown in our behavior; that is in what we do, the way we live must match what we believe

Our faith must be experienced together at home and in the community so that faith can become alive and an experience of a living liturgy: life lived as Eucharistic gift of oneself to the community... and we can say like saint Paul "It is no longer me who lives but Christ living in me..." (Gal 2.20)

A Living faith begins with God, and ends up in an attitude of following Christ as a servant to the community.

Living our lives as a gift received and returned to God is the right attitude of renewing and making our faith alive.

Why all this? because we have been created in God's image, consecrated and sent in baptism for a mission, redeemed by Christ's blood, with the power of the Holy Spirit in us...given at confirmation

How do our daddies come into the picture of the year of faith:

- Daddies, we need you: we are expecting you to live your faith in every decision you make in your family
- In every action you perform at the service and respect of your family and community
- Only then you can speak In truth and in Love... and become credible to your family and community

The rights and duties as members of the Church for participation in the life and mission of the church are based on baptism, rather than ordination or religious profession. This has consequences for the laity in their call to ministry and mission to transform the world. It creates for us a new equality of relationships in the Church.

Daddies, priests, bishops, sisters, we are all baptized for the same mission with different gifts and roles... but with only one faith...

This idea was taken up strongly in the Vatican Council being expressed in its documents. In the formulation of Lumen Gentium the chapter on People of God was deliberately placed before that on Priests, to emphasis our equality in baptism as one people.

"The laity, too, share in the priestly, prophetic and royal office of Christ and therefore have their own role to play in the mission of the whole People of God in the Church and in the world." [AA2]

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"We promote, live and experience in our lives, the Value of DIALOGUE as a way to live Church as Community with our brothers and sisters and the nature around us."



Bishop's Pastoral Message Cont'

- "The laity, by their very vocation, seek the kingdom of God by engaging in temporal affairs and by ordering them according to the plan of God." (LG 31)
- "Laymen... are to be a leaven animating temporal affairs from within, disposing them always to become as Christ would have them." (AD15).
- "As members of the living Christ, all the faithful are duty -bound to cooperate in the expansion and spreading out of His Body." [AG 36]

Follow Pope Benedict, be a humble servant in the vineyard of the Lord: speak the truth with love: be a true prophet: believe the truth, speak the truth, live by the truth that you have received in the gift of Faith then and only then you will be lovable as you must be
