
right direction? Do I have enough fuel to reach the goal?

the HIV/AIDS pandemic that is silently destroying the live of our people here in the Solomon Island.


The program also contrib-

World Youth Day Celebration – Diocese of Gizo (22– 28th July)


NOTE:

EDUCATION 4 LIFE



ABSTINENCE means doing without something of your own free will.

Examples could be: giving up eating meat, drinking alcohol or sexual activity.

To abstain is a <u>free choice</u>, a personal decision which does not interfere with a normal life. Usually, abstinence does not last for a lifetime. It is just for a time while growing up and making sensible choices. There is no need to let everyone know you have chosen abstinence. It's even all right to have a boyfriend or girlfriend, without getting too involved.

Sexual abstinence means putting a stop to all sexual relations or else putting them off till later.

ADVANTAGES OF CHASTITY and ABSTINENCE :

Olt is possible to love without having sex. True love goes beyond sex. That is why, in order to prepare better for the future, you should not have sex before marriage.

Abstinence is the best means of fighting and preventing STDs-AIDS, underage pregnancies and unwanted pregnancies.

Choosing to abstain will cut out false declarations of love, just aimed at getting sex.

It saves you from the burden of having to bring up a child on your own.

It frees you from having to worry about abortion.It ensures that you will never be left with "souvenirs" (infection) by former partners.

It gives you time to observe and get to know the ways of life of the other sex.

It enables you to keep your mind first of all on developing your intellectual and physical abilities.

It tests your spiritual development and devotion to GOD.
